Apply in first-year to study abroad for autumn semester/spring semester of second-year.

Compulsory year abroad

All four-year degree programmes include a compulsory third-year abroad. The options for your year abroad currently include studying at a university through the Erasmus programme, working as a British Council language assistant, or undertaking a work placement through the Erasmus programme. In 2017 the UK Government has invoked Article 50 of the Lisbon Treaty to begin the process of leaving the EU. In October 2019 the latest period of negotiation will end and as of yet the outcome of the negotiations is not certain. The UK Government has made clear that it values international exchanges and collaboration in education and training, and we should remember that the Year Abroad provision for languages students in British universities began many years before the UK's membership of the EU, as has the British Council Teaching assistantship. The Year Abroad will continue, and students at Nottingham will continue to have a range of options for their Year Abroad.
