What is YMS?

- The Youth Mobility Scheme (YMS) is a working holiday programme.
- It emphasises holiday first, work second.
- It is designed to foster indepth cultural exploration and boost international exchanges among young people ages 18 to 30.





What can you do with a YMS visa?

- Take a long holiday in Taiwan
- Take short study courses
- Study Mandarin
- Volunteer
- Work and earn without a working permit







How to apply?





Requirements for application

- UK citizenship
- Aged between 18-30
- No prior YMS status
- Not accompained by dependents



Required documents

- ✓ A completed application form
- ✓ A resume/CV
- ✓ Valid UK passport (for a minimum of 1 year at the time of submission)
- ✓ 2 colour passport photos
- ✓ Travel medical insurance
- Return flight tickets/proof of funds
- √ £50 application fee
- ✓ Evidence of £1600 to support yourself



- A stamped addressed envelope


Walk-in

Processing your application


- Two to three weeks to process
- Refusal of YMS application is at the discretion of the ROC (Taiwan) government
- Application fees are nonrefundable



Almost there...


Type of Visa
 Resident Visa

Duration of stay1 year



After entry into Taiwan

- You cannot apply for another visa type once you have entered Taiwan using the YMS visa
- Taiwanese Alien Resident Certificate
 (ARC) must be applied for within 15 days
 of entry (30 days during COVID-19
 pandemic)
- Within 6 months you must register for National Health Insurance (employers can do it for you)

IT and Engineering


Taiwan has many science parks and is home to international technological talents. Brands - Garmin, Asus, Acer and HTC are based in Taiwan.

Teaching English language both in schools and privately is very welcomed. English is popular among Taiwanese youth.


Art and Design


Artists can apply for residencies in artist villages. Mobile games and Apps industry is strong in Taiwan. Vacancies for designers, programmers and illustrators.






