Come along to The University of Nottingham's University Park Campus to find out more about investigating the Great War connections in your family.

Guest speakers will share their expertise to help newcomers make the best start in finding their past. For those who have already been researching their families, our Digital Humanities Centre (DHC) will be open for you to digitise your First World War family photographs, documents and even 3D objects, helping you to preserve and share them.

DHC manager Matt Davies will run sessions throughout the day discussing the benefits of creating, storing and sharing digital versions of historic mementoes, in whatever form they come: photographs, letters, posters, badges, medals – even larger 3D items such as helmets.

He will demonstrate the wide range of

digitisation equipment available in the centre and will be pleased to help visitors to digitise any First World War artefacts that you bring along on the day and help you upload them onto relevant social media sites.
