Flowers, Forests and Folklore' project





Our project aims to enable 12 adults with learning disabilities to explore the significance of flowers and trees within the cultural and horticultural heritage of Southwell and environs in a way that is meaningful to individuals. An appropriately qualified project worker, support worker, volunteers and specialist arts workers will support learners to explore folklore and traditional practices relating to flowers, wood and leaves through visits to local sites of interest, arts and crafts, and participatory performance activities including music and dance. Learners will share their learning with the local community via a celebration event, ICT and participation in local community events.

Southwell Care Project supports adults with learning disabilities in North Nottinghamshire. We currently support 135 adults with learning disabilities through our four pods in Southwell, Newark and Mansfield. We aim to provide tailored, personal activities that enable our clients to build confidence and self-esteem, and to participate more fully in community life.
