Your account and registration





University Regulations

You are now a member of the university, and must abide by our codes of practice:

- Acceptable Use Policy and Information Security Policy
- University regulations: nottingham.ac.uk/studentservices/servicedetails/reg ulations
- Never lend your university card to anyone













Username and email

- IT Account ensure you have set up your account, you will receive an email three weeks before your course start date inviting you to activate your account via: <u>itaccounts.nottingham.ac.uk</u>
- Ensure you set security questions and change the default password, Guidance can be found here: <u>password.nottingham.ac.uk</u>
- Your username will be similar to: eeyabc1
- Your email address will be:
 - <u>username@nottingham.ac.uk</u> (undergraduate/postgraduate taught)
 - <u>first.lastname@nottingham.ac.uk</u> (postgraduate research and staff)





Multi-Factor Authentication

- Multi-factor authentication (MFA) is required to authenticate for an increasing number of remote access services such as Microsoft 365.
- We recommend that you have your MFA authentication device with you at all times while taking part in on/off campus activities and teaching.
- You will be prompted to authenticate every 90 days for each new device you use and more frequently for some services.

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Multi-Factor Authentication

To set up the Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) service, you will need:

- A computer, such as desktop/laptop PC or MacBook, which will be used to set up your MFA account
- A mobile device (SIM-enabled phone or tablet/iPad), which will be used to approve access requests via MFA
- Your university login details

You will then need to:

- use the guide to Set up MFA
- Install the recommended Microsoft Authenticator app on your mobile device

EU Students

 May be required to attend in person registration depending on your EUSS settlement scheme permission. Please see the <u>in-person registration</u> page for details

Wi-Fi on campus

- Go to Wi-Fi settings and select eduroam
- When prompted enter your university email address: e.g. <u>username@nottingham.ac.uk</u>
- Enter your university password

Visit the <u>Internet and web services</u> page for device-specific information.





Email

- We strongly recommend you get the Outlook app to use email and your calendar.
- All official university communication will be sent via email.
- Check your university email account daily during term-time, and weekly during holiday periods.
- Make use of the calendar to help manage your time.
- Set an email signature with your name, course and year group (and preferred pronouns if you like).
- Make sure you send your email to the right person! Most members of staff have (staff) after their name.

Cyber safety

 What is phishing? It is where attackers attempt to steal data, such as personal information, passwords and bank details etc..

They do so by tricking people with fake emails, adverts and phone calls to reveal your data.

Don't take the bait:

- don't click links or download attachments if you're unsure
- don't give personal details over the phone, text message or What's App if you're unsure.
- Check <u>actionfraud.police.uk</u> for latest news, alerts and cybercrime protection advice.

Moodle

Moodle is the University's Virtual Learning Environment (VLE).

Each module you study has its own Moodle page with learning materials and activities, such as:

- accessing reading lists
- watching recorded lectures
- submitting coursework.

You will keep access to all your Moodle pages throughout your time at university.





Using Moodle

Access Moodle on a web browser at: https://moodle.nottingham.ac.uk

Log in with your University username and password.

 Please ensure you have fully completed the IT account set up and registration process as mentioned earlier – otherwise you will not be able to log into Moodle.

Your modules will appear within the **My Modules** page the next working day after they have been added to your student record.

Accessing software

Microsoft 365

- Download the latest Microsoft 365 apps for free on up to five devices for use during your studies.
- When starting a new piece of work, start here: portal.office.com.
- Use OneDrive to store all your work and use Teams for collaborative work with other students.
- See our <u>Office 365 guides</u> for lots of top tips.

Course software

- Any other software you may need is installed on our computers, and you may be entitled to install a copy for free on your personal device.
- Visit the <u>Software Store</u> to find out more.





Access to computing

On campus

- There are many <u>computer rooms</u> you can access these are located mainly inside libraries.
- Some computers may have different software installed based on the requirements of the local schools / departments.

Virtual

- You can also use the Windows Virtual Desktop (WVD) to access university applications that are not available on your personal device.
- Desktops available depend on your course check the <u>Virtual Desktop</u> webpage for more details.

Note, always save work onto your Microsoft OneDrive as the desktop profile is not permanent.





Print, copy and scan

Print, copy or scan at many locations on campus.

- Activate your print account by sending a document to print from a university computer or
- swipe your university card at a print device and login with your university username and password.

Once activated, a default starting balance of 50p credit is added. Top-up online at: <u>myprint.nottingham.ac.uk</u>.

- You can print from your personal computer email documents to: <u>mobileprint@nottingham.ac.uk</u> from your university account.
- You can also scan documents to your OneDrive or university email.
