Do I need to sign in?

You don't need to formally register when you arrive at University Park Campus, but you will need to register on Jubilee and Sutton Bonington Campuses.

Please bring your invitation letter and hand it in at one of our information points (marked on the campus maps by the  icon) to get your free tote bag.

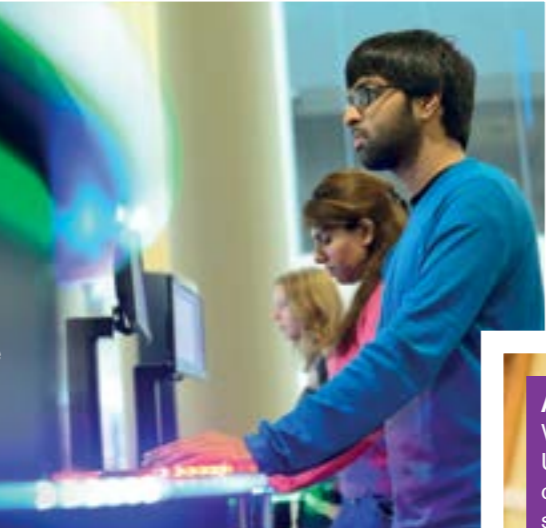

Travelling to Nottingham

Getting here, parking and staying overnight



By train

- For University Park and Jubilee Campuses, book a train to Nottingham railway station.
- For Sutton Bonington Campus, book a train to Loughborough railway station.

Staff and students in purple t-shirts will be at both train stations, to direct you towards the free shuttle buses to the campuses.

By bus

- For University Park and Jubilee Campuses, travel to Broadmarsh bus station. Then take a short walk to Nottingham railway station where shuttle buses are available to the campuses.
- For Sutton Bonington Campus, we recommend you travel by train to Loughborough railway station and use the free shuttle bus service.

If you prefer to travel by bus to Sutton Bonington, please travel to Broadmarsh bus station in Nottingham and follow the above instructions on how to get to University Park Campus. Once at University Park, take a free shuttle bus to Sutton Bonington Campus (see page 41 for timetables).

Open day shuttle bus services are free, however, if you prefer to travel by public transport, the tram runs directly from Nottingham railway station to the University. See www.thetram.net for more information.

By car

University Park and Jubilee Campuses

Free parking for University Park and Jubilee Campuses is available at University Park only. A free shuttle bus will run between the campuses all day.

From the M1

Leave the M1 at junction 25 to join the A52, signposted to Nottingham. Follow the A52 to Nottingham for approximately four miles and then follow the directions below to the West or North Entrance, depending on your subject of interest.

There are other exits to Nottingham from the M1. However, we recommend you follow the above which is the most direct route to the University from both the M1 north and the M1 south.

West Entrance – for visitors interested in arts, law and social science subjects

At the Toby Carvery roundabout, turn right on to the A6464, Woodside Road. Turn left at the next roundabout to enter the University's West Entrance.

North Entrance – for visitors interested in science, engineering, medicine and health science subjects

At the Toby Carvery roundabout, take the second exit continuing on the A52, Derby Road. At the Queen's Medical Centre roundabout, take the fourth exit and then take the first left to enter the University's North Entrance.


From the city centre

Those travelling from the city centre to University Park Campus should follow signs to the Queen's Medical Centre, and then follow the directions on the AA road signs for the University's North or West Entrances (see above and left).

Car parking

When you arrive on campus, security staff will help you find a parking space.

When you get here

You don't need to formally register, so you can go straight to your activities. Remember to hand in your invitation letter at an information point  to receive your free tote bag.

If you need to get to Jubilee or Sutton Bonington Campuses from University Park, free shuttle buses run from the open day bus terminal on East Drive (see pages 40-43). There's also a shuttle bus which runs in a loop around University Park (see page 42). Remember to register when you arrive at Jubilee or Sutton Bonington Campuses.

Sutton Bonington Campus

If you are travelling by car you can make your way directly to Sutton Bonington Campus, where free parking is available.

From the M1

Leave the M1 at junction 24, signposted Nottingham (South), East Midlands Airport and A6. Join the A6, Derby Road, towards Kegworth. Turn left into Side Ley, following signs to Sutton Bonington and the yellow AA road signs to The University of Nottingham Open Day Sutton Bonington Campus.

Follow the road over a canal and turn right into Station Road, signposted Sutton Bonington Campus. Turn right onto College Road. The West Entrance to the campus is on the left-hand side.

Car parking

When you arrive on campus, follow directions to open day car parking, highlighted yellow on the map and marked with a .

When you get here

On arrival, please make your way to the registration desks:

- The Barn (student amenities centre) – School of Biosciences degrees
- School of Veterinary Medicine and Science reception – veterinary medicine and science degrees

Culture

Nottingham Lakeside Arts on University Park Campus presents a year-round programme of performing and visual arts, workshops and festivals. High quality theatre, ballet, opera and drama can also be found at the Royal Concert Hall, the Theatre Royal or the Nottingham Playhouse. There are also several comedy clubs in and around Nottingham.

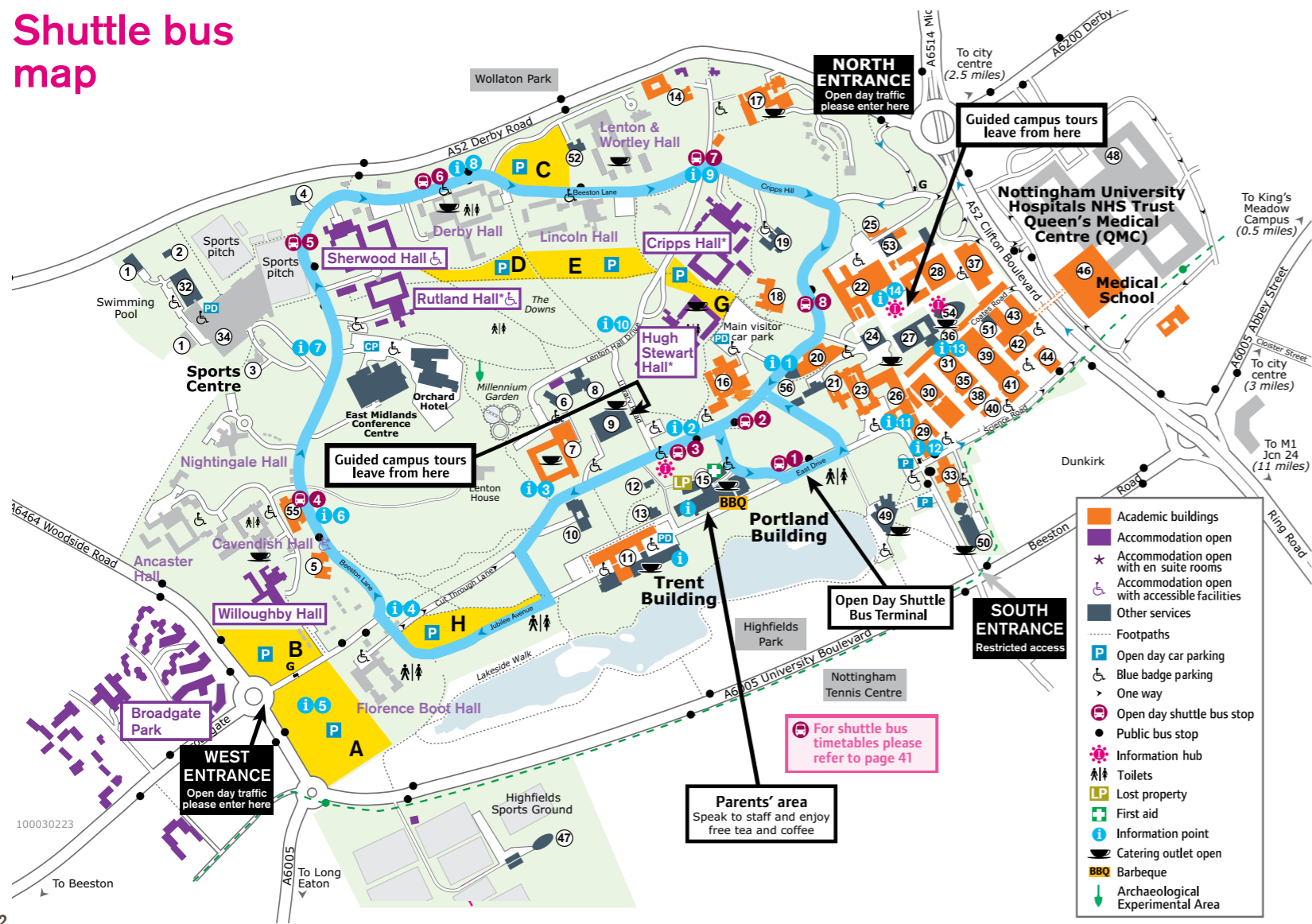
