
4th World Congress of Scottish Literature 3rd – 6th July 2024



USEFUL INFORMATION FOR DELEGATES

WELCOME

We are delighted to welcome you to the University of Nottingham and to the 4th World Congress of Scottish Literature.

Here is some useful information whilst you are staying with us. Should you require any further assistance, please speak to a member of the conference team (identifiable by their blue t shirts with a white conference logo) who will be more than happy to help.

YOUR ACCOMMODATION

If you are staying at the Jubilee Conference Hotel on Jubilee Campus you will have been sent separate check in/out information

Check-in/out Procedures for Rutland Hall

On arrival, please go to Welcome Point Central (located in cottage opposite barriers to Orchard hotel, 59 on the campus map)) to check in.

Please inform the porters if you may require extra assistance in the unlikely event of an evacuation from your accommodation (e.g. hearing, sight or mobility difficulties). Upon check in, you will receive a bedroom key and either a swipe card, 'block' or fob key. The main doors/block doors are locked 24 hours and on card access only.

If you arrive before 3pm you can bring your luggage up to the Trent Building and store at the registration desk from 12pm until you check in.

Rooms must be vacated and the keys returned to your Welcome Point by 10:00 on your day of departure. On the day of your departure, if you require luggage storage please bring your luggage up to the Trent Building Senate Chamber and the Conference team will look after it until your departure.

You will be able to register prior to or on arrival. Please note you can log in for 7 days before you will need to re-register.

Delegates who have booked accommodation at the University have access to the David Ross Sports Village. Please show your room key at the Sports Centre Reception for access to a range of sporting facilities, including a 25m x 8 Lane swimming pool. There is also a Café open 7 days a week.

CONFERENCE LOCATION

All of the panel sessions will be taking place in the Trent Building (Building 11 on the campus map) apart from the public lecture on Wednesday 3rd July which will take place in the Sir Clive Granger Building (Building 16 on the campus map)

The Senate Chamber (located on the Lower Ground Floor) will be used for our refreshment breaks and dinners.

REGISTRATION

The registration desk will be located in the Trent Building Foyer on Wednesday 3rd July and will be open from 12pm (noon) until 6pm. From Thursday 4th July the conference helpdesk will be located in the Trent Building Senate Chamber and will be open from 9am until 5pm daily. PARKING

From East Midlands Airport (approximately 10 miles)

There is a 24 hour <u>Skylink bus service</u> from East Midlands Airport to Nottingham City Centre. It does travel through several small towns and villages before it reaches Nottingham but you can get off at the beginning of University Boulevard, which is the stop closest to Rutland Hall or further along the road for closer access to the Trent Building. Journey time is around 1hr 15mins depending on traffic.

You can also walk to the taxi rank on the terminal forecourt and take a direct taxi to the University. Taxis are normally available 24 hours a day and cost around £25 one way.

By Train

There are 2 train stations that are close to the University of Nottingham, Beeston train station and Nottingham train station.

From Beeston Station you can walk to the bus and tram stops in Beeston town center, approximately 0.5 miles, alternatively you could call a taxi.

From Nottingham train station you can catch a tram or take a short walk into the centre where you can get a bus to the university.

By Tram

The University of Nottingham is now connected with the rest of the city by <u>Tram</u>, during the day, 7am-9pm, the tram operates every 7-10 minutes, early & Late, 6am-7am and 9pm-12am, the tram operates every 15 minutes. Tickets must be purchased before boarding.

The tram service operates a "turn up and go" service, with trams from every 7 minutes during the week and from every 10 minutes at weekends. Displays at every stop will let you know when the next tram is due to arrive.

When travelling on the tram from Nottingham City Centre or Nottingham Train Station you need to get the tram that is travelling to **Toton Lane.**

If travelling from Beeston you can either get off at University Boulevard or stay on and get off at the University of Nottingham stop. You should board the tram bound for **Hucknall**.

By Bus

There are a number of bus services that have stops close by to the University Park campus. There is one bus that runs from the center of Nottingham through the university.

Tickets

Tickets for the tram need to be purchased prior to boarding the tram, they do have Revenue Protection Officers that board the trams to check tickets. All tram stops have machines where you can buy tickets. Day tickets for all day travel are around £5.30 and single tickets are £3.20. You will need exact change or you can use a Debit/Credit card at either the vending machines or with a credit/debit card via the lime green validators at all tram stops

Tickets for buses can be purchased on the bus itself using either cash or by tapping on with your Credit/Debit card.

By Taxi

There are taxi ranks throughout the city and immediately adjacent to the main railway and bus stations. The journey to the campus, from the city Centre, takes approximately 15 minutes. We recommend <u>DG Cars</u> (https://dgcars.co.uk/ book online or phone 0115 9607607) or Ubers are readily available and reasonably priced in Nottingham.

Avoid rogue and unlicensed taxi drivers - If you get into a Private Hire car without pre-booking it (that is - you stop it or find it in the street) you may not be covered by insurance. Private Hire drivers call this 'flying' and they know they are breaking the law. If you are involved in an accident you will experience difficulty in claiming for any damage or injuries. Our advice is to always pre-book a private hire vehicle by phone, website or an app.

By Car

From M1 Motorway

Leave the M1 motorway at Junction 25 to join the A52 to Nottingham. Turn right at The Priory roundabout (about 4 miles from M1), then left at next roundabout to enter the University's West Entrance.

WHAT IF I NEED A QUIET MOMENT?

Conferences can be very full-on, often intense and this conference will be a busy conference with well over 120 delegates.

It is perfectly normal to feel that you might want to have a few moments to yourself in peace and quiet. The area to the west of the Trent Building is grassed and has plenty of tree shade. It also leads down to the lake, which has a circular path and can be a quiet place.

Walking Routes

The University of Nottingham campus has several beautiful gardens, a lake and some lots of greenery for you to enjoy. Lakeside Arts Centre

<u>Lakeside Arts Centre</u> is the region's leading venue for theatre and dance for children and families, delivering an internationally recognised chamber and world music programme and originating an expertly curated exhibitions programme in visual arts and archaeology, with the former focusing on modern and contemporary British art.

Based at the southern entrance to University Park and adjacent to the ever-popular Highfields Park, there are several nice exhibition on during the conference and a lovely café.

PRAYER ROOMS

The University provides a range of rooms on every campus for prayer and religious observance. This includes a Christian chapel, Muslim prayer rooms, and several multi faith prayer rooms which are available to all faiths.

Christian Prayer Rooms

The chapel & chapel lounge can be found on A floor, Portland Building. Follow the signs for Oasis, Chaplaincy and Faith Support (A29).

Muslim Prayer Rooms

These rooms can be found in the Portland Building in the new extension – Brothers in D139 and Sisters in E136.

All Faith Prayer Rooms

Multi Faith Prayer Room opposite chapel on A floor, Portland Building.

LOCAL AMENITIES

Printing

If you need printed handouts, please ensure that you being them with you as there are limited printing facilitates on University Park. There is a print shop in the Portland building but they will require 24hrs notice. They are open 9am – 5pm Monday to Friday. portlandprintingco@nottingham.ac.uk

Portland Building

There are cash machines in the Portland Building, along with a Spar mini supermarket shop selling a variety of food and goods, including stationery and a University of Nottingham merchandise shop. You can also find the food court on the top floor (accessible by both stairs and a lift – not open Weekends) There is also a Blackwell's bookshop where you will receive a 10% discount if you show your delegate badge.
