Longship to set sail for Mersey next month

THE largest ever replica Viking longship will set sail for Merseyside in its maiden overseas voyage next month.

The 115ft Draken Harald Hårfagre, named after Norway's most famous Viking king, Harald the Fairhair, will be rowed into West Float, in Wallasey, three weeks after sailing out from Haugesund, on the west coast of Norway.

The voyage was originally due to take place last year, but was delayed for more testing.

The longship is now set to

The longship is now set to arrive in Wallasey on July 18 – at a time when the world's media and thousands of visitors will be flocking to Wirral for the golf Open Championships at the Royal Liverpool club, in Hoylake.

It will be crewed by a hundredstrong "Viking Navy" of volunteers, many from Wirral, who travelled to Norway last year for a weekend of training sessions.

Merseyside Viking expert Professor Steve Harding, who helped secure the visit, said: "It's tremendous news for Wirral and Liverpool and very poignant concerning the huge Norse roots of the area.

"The West Float, on the Wallasey docks, is the site of the former Wallasey Pool and its highly likely there would have been longships here a millennium ago, and now, after this break, there will be one here again."

Liverpool Victoria Rowing Club, in Wallasey, will host the vessel until its departure on August 3, with around 70 of the oarsmen rowing it over either from or trained by the club.

The choice of the mooring it-



self has its own Viking link, as the rowing club is located next to Penny Bridge – once known as Tokisford – the crossing point of a Norseman called Toki. Professor Harding said that

Professor Harding said that while the longship won't be stopping off at the Albert Dock after it was deemed impractical following discussions with the city council, it may return to visit Liverpool in future.

MERSEYSIDE'S LASTING LEGACY FROM THE VIKINGS

MERSEYSIDE was picked for the longship's voyage because of its Viking links.

The Vikings arrived in the North West after their expulsion from Dublin in AD902. Their legacy can be seen in the large number of place names in Merseyside ending with "by" – a Viking term meaning settlement or farmstead. In Wirral, Meols was originally Melr, meaning sandbank, while the name West Kirby is from the old Norse for "settlement with the church". Toxteth, Formby and Crosby are of Norse origin while Tranmere Rovers is the only team in the football league with a

/IKING VILLAGE SET TO OPEN THIS SUMMER

THE first stage of Wirral's Viking village tourist attraction is set to open to the public later this summer.

Bromborough-based social enterprise Big Heritage has linked up with Claremont Farm to put together plans for an entire life-size Viking-age settlement on 10 acres of the farm's land in Bebington.

It is hoped the 10th-century replica village will become the North West's answer to York's world-famous Jorvik Centre.

Dean Paton, Big
Heritage founder, said
the group were hoping
the first buildings in the
settlement would be
constructed by the end
of August, at which
point volunteers will be
sought to get involved
with the next stages of
the carbon-neutral
project, with plans for it
to grow in size over the
coming years.

Big Heritage has now linked up with Wirral-based salvage firm

O'Grady's, which will be donating timber for the buildings and a Viking age cross for the village.
