Stories from Future Food

<u>Sharing is caring amongst some plant species.</u> A new paper, published in *Nature Communications*, shows how plant species might share pre-adapted genes to save another species from extinction.

A new project, funded by GCRF, makes use of big data mining and machine learning to improve the detection and treatment of cholera in Bangladesh.
