


Membership Categorization Analysis

 - "Would you take a look at my testicles, doctor?"






Youth Club

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
NHS

Identity, illness and online support

Using linguistic analysis to illuminate experiences of mental illness.

- Online support groups for eating disorders:
 - Popular source of information for patients.
 - Coming to terms with difficult or stigmatised conditions amongst others.
 - ▶ Have an attested influence on 'real world' healthcare behaviours.
- What I'm interested in:
 - How the meaning of 'anorexia' and the identity of a 'person with anorexia' is negotiated linguistically.
 - Illness experiences as interactional products.

- I know I need [nutritional advice] because ? ED always convinces me that I am having plenty...even though clearly that isn't the case.
- I felt like I was gross and lazy. I didn't think I could stand it and
 ED was telling me how much I would have to compensate today by not eating much and by walking a lot.
- I know its ? ED telling me that boney looks good; but it sure would be nice to have a bum back and my 'bra' to fit better!;)

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Identity, illness and online support

- Group members make grammatical choices that separate anorexia from themselves.
- At the same time, they present anorexia as having a will of its own and controlling them.
- Construct disempowered identities.
- Linguistic choices help manage with the stigma and responsibility of mental health difficulties.
- Conflicts over 'the ED' are resolved interactively...
