## Activities for your school Pre-16

## Pre-16 In-school sessions: booking form

## KS3: Introduction to Higher Education (GB7)(CDF1, CDF2, CDF3)

This session introduces the concept of higher education, the range of courses, extracurricular activities and explores future career options. Delivered to groups of up to 30 students (interactive session) or in an assembly format for the whole year group.

## KS3: Exploring careers and post-14 options (GB2, GB3, GB4, GB7)(CDF1, CDF2, CDF3, CDF4)

An interactive session for year 8/9 pupils that will increase their awareness of careers and associated degrees. The pupils will consider what their skills and qualities are and how to evidence these. Delivered to groups of up to 30 students.

#### KS4: Is University right for me? (GB3, GB7)(CDF2, CDF3)

This session explores the benefits of going to university. Students will learn how best to research, understand student finance and how university differs to school. Delivered to groups of up to 30 students (interactive session) or in an assembly format for the whole year.

## KS4: Building confidence and resilience (GB8)(CDF3, CDF5)

This session allows students to explore confidence and resilience to support unexpected setbacks. Students will be introduced to coping strategies used to aid resilience for their future. Delivered to groups of up to 30 students.

#### KS4: Memory techniques for effective revision (GB8)(CDF1)

An interactive session to help prepare pupils for their revision and exams. Delivered to groups of up to 30 students.

#### KS4: Careers workshop (GB2, GB4, GB7)(CD1, CDF2, CDF3)

An activity based session that identifies the different strengths, skills and qualifications needed for a variety of careers. The importance of networking and how this can be done successfully, will also be examined. This session is available for small groups up to 30 students.

#### KS3/KS4: Campus visits (GB2, GB3, GB4, GB7)(CDF1, CDF2, CDF3)

Our campus visits are available for all year groups and can be delivered to a maximum of 60 students. The visit to the University gives students an insight into university life with the aim of raising aspirations and providing them with information, advice and guidance. Students will participate in a range of interactive workshops, meet current student ambassadors and tour one of our campuses.

## Self-delivered materials: booking form

#### KS3/KS4: Interactive toolkits (GB7)(CDF3)

Our online toolkits cover a range of topics. All sessions can last between 30mins to an hour and be delivered to any year group. We recommend these be presented within a computer-based classroom, allowing students to navigate the material individually. Topics include:

- University accommodation
- Understanding the differences between universities
- The significance of sports and societies within higher education
