1pm School welcome and afternoon session begins

You will be directed to the A03 lecture theatre where the afternoon programme begins. You will then be guided by our Subject Ambassadors to your subject-specific activities.

1.15pm Subject-specific activities

Your afternoon programme is structured so you can select the talks relevant to your personal subject choices. This will normally consist of a subject talk explaining how your subject is taught, and how the course is structured. In the talk you'll hear about options for the third year spent abroad, and students will have the opportunity to take part in a seminar. If you are attending for a joint honours course, you will also receive information about the English, History or Philosophy part of your degree.

For parents, guardians and other visitors, we invite you to attend a Q&A session to ask any questions you may have. Staff will be on hand to answer questions on how study abroad is managed, and you'll be able to hear from current students about their year abroad experiences too.

We will have a refreshment break between sessions when you can grab a hot drink, chat informally to academic staff and current students, and ask any questions you may have.

Our student ambassadors will escort you between venues. School activities will finish at 3.30pm.
