Your afternoon programme is structured into three sections. In our first period, we will talk about how you can make choices in liberal arts. This is an opportunity to speak to a personal tutor about the decisions you might make regarding the subjects you want to study and how you shape your liberal arts degree.

Our second session will be a sample seminar about what you can expect from the core modules you will study. Liberal Arts is about interdisciplinary study, and we will use this session to demonstrate the importance of thinking differently.

In our final session, we will have a Q&A session with our students so you can ask questions about life in Nottingham, specific modules, timetables, study abroad and the experiences gained on the programme.

We will have a refreshment break between sessions when you can grab a hot drink and chat informally to academic staff and current students and ask any questions.

Our subject ambassadors will escort you between venues. School activities will finish at 3.15pm.
